Parking and Entry

Please note that **NO DOGS** (except for certified assistance dogs or 4-H Dog Club) are permitted on the grounds during the Fair. It is usually hot so please leave your furry friends at home and not in a hot car for any reason!

General Information

Awards:

- 1. The prizes will not be awarded unless considered worthy of merit. The judges' decision is final. Prize money will be paid in accordance with judges' decision.
- 2. See the section on judging, #25, #26, #27.
- 3. All ribbons & awards must be displayed during the fair.
- 4. Should there be insufficient funds to pay prizes in full they will be paid pro-rata.
- 5. Prize money shall be forfeited by any exhibitor who removes any exhibit(s) in any section or display before 5:00pm on Sunday, the last day of the Fair.
- 6. Please pick up your prize money or request a payment by cheque at the fair office on Saturday or Sunday for non-livestock prize winners. 4-H prize money will be mailed to club leaders.
- 7. Cheques will be mailed to winners unable to collect their winnings in person, provided the total is \$20.00 or more. Cheques will not be mailed for amounts under \$20.00. Prize money not requested by the calendar year end, December 31, will be considered a donation to the fair.
- 8. The association will not be responsible for non-payment of prize money offered by others.
- 9. Points won by a junior in an adult section will not be credited in a junior section.
- 10. Complaints re: nonpayment or mis payment of prize money must be registered with the fair administration by October 31 of the same year as the fair.

Entries:

The Arrowsmith Agricultural Association's Animal Premise number is BC44HJXVC.

- 11. The "entry" refers to the written entries pre-registered on the entry forms provided by the Coombs Fair, or a reasonable facsimile.
- 12. Entry fees are shown below division headings.
- 13. One (1) entry per person per class unless otherwise stated.
- 14. One 'entry form' per exhibitor. Livestock must be entered on a separate entry form from non-livestock entries even if entered by the same exhibitor. Poultry entries must be on a poultry entry form. Horse show entries must be on a Horse Entry Form. 4-H must use 4-H entry forms or club members can be listed with age must use 4-H entry forms or club members can be listed with age and all classes to be entered in on a separate piece of paper.
- 15. Entry forms for children must state the age of the exhibitor.
- 16. Entry fees must accommodate entry forms. Entry forms can be mailed, or hand delivered and must be received as follows:

Poultry & Livestock: Thursday, July 29, one week prior to the start of the Fair. No late entries for Poultry. \$1.00 extra per late entry in Livestock, **no late entries** after 5pm Monday before the Fair. THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. Horticulture, Floral, Arts & Crafts, Needlework, Domestic Science: on or before Monday prior to the start of the

Fair. Entry forms received late, after 5pm Monday before the Fair, will be charged an additional late fee of 50c per entry.

- 17. Entry forms with entry fees can be submitted from June 1 to the date specified in each section. Mail to: Coombs Fair, PO Box 195, Coombs, BC VOR 1MO; or deliver to the drop box beside Fair office doors; or via email to entries@coombsfair.org.
- 18. NO ENTRY FEES WILL BE REFUNDED

Exhibits:

- 19. The word "Exhibit" refers to the actual article, item or animal being exhibited for competition.
- 20. Exhibits must be on the grounds as follows:

Arts & Crafts, Needlework, Photography: items must be delivered on Thursday before the Fair from 6-8pm. Articles cannot be accepted on Friday.

Horticulture, Floral, Domestic Science: from 6-7pm on Thursday or 7:30-9:00am on Friday. Judging of the above sections begins at 10am sharp on Friday.

Livestock: on Friday from 5-10pm.

Poultry: on Thursday 3-9pm, judged Friday 8am.

Guinea Pigs: 5-9pm, Friday.

All other livestock judges during the Fair.

21. All exhibits must be made or grown by and be the property of the exhibitor or family. In Arts & Crafts and Needlework, exhibits must have been made by the exhibitor within three (3) years of the date of the fair, and not have been previously exhibited for competition at the Coombs Fair.

Livestock must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and be in the exhibitor's possession not less than 30 days prior to the Fair. LIVESTOCK WITHOUT AN ID TAG WILL NOT BE REGISTERED AND WILL BE REFUSED ENTRY AS AN EXHIBIT.

- 22. One (1) exhibit per class per exhibitor unless otherwise stated. Livestock and poultry exhibitors may enter more than one exhibit per class.
- 23. Exhibits may not be removed from any exhibit or display until 5pm on Sunday, the last day of the Fair, unless by special permission of the director in charge. (See awards section #5 & 6)

Judging:

- 24. Any person interfering with or attempting to influence a judge, or using abusive language towards a judge, shall forfeit any prize money to which he/she may have been entitled.
- 25. If there are at least three (3) exhibits of similar type entries in; any other', a separate class may be created as determined by the judge.

- 26. If there are five (5) or more exhibits in a class, a third prize will be paid. If there are fewer than three (3) exhibits in a class, no second prize money will be given unless the judge feels it is warranted.
- 27. Judges may withhold any prize where the exhibits are of insufficient merit, or they may substitute a "Highly Commended" card in lieu of a prize award.

Liabilities & Obligations:

- 28. The Arrowsmith Agricultural Association will take every precaution to ensure the safety of exhibits entered in the Coombs Fair, but the owners themselves must take the risk of entering them and should any exhibit in whole or part be damaged, injured, or stolen, the Association WILL NOT be liable for the value thereof. Exhibit buildings are under supervision during the hours open to the public and buildings are locked at all other times. A night watch is on the grounds Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights.
- 29. Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion, and other exhibits that could cause injury, accident, or damage to property or to a person coming in contact with the exhibit shall guard their exhibits to protect the public from coming into contact with them.
- 30. Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Association from and against all claims, demands, costs, damage of property, which may occur from injury, accident or damage of property to exhibits being improperly guarded, or the public not being properly guarded from.
- 31. Each exhibitor shall assume the responsibility for any injury occurring to themselves, or their assistants, while exhibiting or performing.
- 32. Any protests must be made in writing to the Fair Director before 5pm on the last day of the fair with a deposit of \$25.00. This deposit will be forfeited if the objection is not sustained.



4-H Information

4-H is an educational program providing the opportunity for urban as well as rural youth to learn valued agricultural and handicraft skills in wide-ranging topics: from animal, plant, and soil sciences; through mechanics, photography, and creative arts. The projects are limited only by the number of adults willing to facilitate each group. For example, youth can train a dog, raise a chicken, fix small engines, or produce fine art. Age-appropriate skills are acquired in looking after and handling the project; during that process, young people learn management skills.

Opportunities for learning the skills of leadership are found in every phase of 4-H work. A large variety of travel opportunities are offered due to organization across Canada by club, district, region, and province.

All 4-H projects that are made and raised throughout the year in our District are on display at the Fair. The 4-H awards system is designed to aid the individual personal development of the member. Awards are given on the basis of a member's personal growth or achievement, where a member is rated against their own experience and capacity as compared to a standard. All badges and certificates are awarded on this basis. 4-H is a highly respected program for which students can receive high school credits.

Boys and girls who have reached their 6th birthday by midnight, December 31 of the previous year and who have not reached their 22nd birthday by midnight December 31 of the previous year are eligible for membership in a 4-H club. The enrollment deadline is March 1 for all clubs.

Local 4-H Classes

Open to Parksville-Qualicum 4-H ONLY

Due to limitations from COVID-19, 4-H Classes are only open to our local Parksville-Qualicum 4-H Clubs this year. Other clubs please check back next year!

ENTRY FEE: None (unless specified).

RULES:

- 1. For 2021 (due to COVID) 4-H classes are only open to our local Parksville-Qualicum 4-H Clubs. Current year registered projects only.
- 2. Judging uses the Danish system, except where noted.
- 3. "Local 4-H" achievement classes are available provided the Fair Secretary is notified at least 30 days in advance.
- 4. Dairy, Beef, Sheep, Goats, Cavy and Swine to be on the grounds by 9:30 pm on the Friday prior to the Fair.
- 5. Poultry to be caged between 3-9 pm on Thursday.
- 6. All animals must be fitted and shown by the 4-H member. Help with fitting or showing will result in loss of prize money.
- 7. No early departures with animals (see p. 6, Exhibit rule #24).
- 8. Limited amount of bedding will be available.
- 9. Initial bedding will be supplied. More straw available for purchase. Hay will be available for purchase also.
- 10. Showmanship order may change at show time.
- 11. All registered 4-H participants will be issued a wrist band to be worn over the two days of the fair. Anyone without a wrist band must pay entry gate fee (see p. X).
- 12. All swine, goats, cattle and sheep must have a government I.D. tag. *See p. 3, Awards Rule #3 at the front of this book.

Entry deadline for all animal exhibit registrations is Thursday, July 29, 2021.

- 2. Entry forms must be completed as to section, division, class and breed.
- 3. All birds must be purebred with the exception of Division F.
- 4. All birds may be caged Thursday 3:00-9:00pm. Judging begins at 8am Friday.
- 5. Exhibits to be judged by the American Association Poultry Standards. CLOSED JUDGING
- 6. No diseased birds permitted in show. All lousy or diseased birds must be removed by owner.
- 7. No exhibits or displays to be removed before 5:00pm on Sunday the last day of the Fair. Anyone removing displays before 5pm will forfeit prize money.
- 8. All breeds and varieties to be judged separately.
- 9. All birds must be owned by the exhibitor for a minimum of 30 days before showing.
- 10. Cage space may limit entries.
- 11. No 4-H birds in OPEN EVENTS.
- 12. Classes will be provided for all breeds provided that there are AT LEAST 5 or more birds in the class.
- 13. There will be NO prize money unless there is a class. See rule #12 re Classes.
- 14. Prizes will be awarded at the judge's discretion.
- 15. Exhibitors of species listed on the Migratory Birds Convention Act, 1994 must have appropriate permit(s) in place to enter birds.

The Standard of Perfection is used in judging.

However, this is not a Provincial Horticultural Show, so emphasis is given to exhibition, friendly competition, and community fun!

OPEN CLASSES

ENTRY FEE: \$1.00 per entry; \$1.50 per entry after Monday before the Fair.

PRIZE MONEY: 1st - \$5.00 2nd - \$3.00 3rd - \$2.00

Sponsored prizes & rosettes for Grand Champion in Show, Best Exhibits in each division and ribbons & prizes for Feature 2021 Berries and Heaviest Zucchini.

RULES: For OPEN and JUNIOR Classes

- 1. Exhibits MUST be grown by the exhibitor, except wild blackberries.
- 2. All entries must be named, specify variety where possible.
- 3. Two (2) entries per class per exhibitor, provided they are different varieties.
- 4. Entry forms and fees to be submitted by the Monday before the Fair. Earlier is better. See Rule 17 in General Information.
- 5. Exhibits must be on the grounds between 6-8pm on Thursday or between 7:30-9:30am. On Friday before the Fair. Judging begins at 10am on Friday.
- 6. Exhibits must NOT be removed before 4pm Sunday.
- 7. All display containers will be supplied.

General Tips for All Exhibitors: Please read

All exhibits MUST have the correct number, size and uniformity as specified.

- Apples, pears or plums must be displayed with stems on, as should beans and tomatoes
- Apples should be wiped clean.
- Plums should NOT be wiped clean.
- Berries should be uniform, well formed, with bloom left on, cores and hulls removed except where specified, like strawberries.
- Nuts must be from last years crop.
- Long keeping vegetables should be firm and mature.
- Cabbages and similar vegetables should be properly trimmed (do NOT over trim)
- Wash all root vegetables but do not buff or scrub them, trim tops to specified lengths (except potatoes).
- Potatoes should be brushed free of dirt NOT washed
- Dried herbs to be named
- AOV means All Other Varieties and AOC means All Other Colours

TIPS FOR EXHIBITORS:

- A. Use only the BEST flowers for show.
- B. Make sure all your exhibits have water.
- C. "MEASURE UP" ... make sure to measure flower arrangements and flowers that have a size restriction.
- D. Containers must be provided by the exhibitor and be an appropriate size for the flower(s) in them.
- E. Stabilize your containers with rocks, sand, etc. in the bottom so that they will not tip over.
- F. If possible, all varieties of flowers should be named this informs the public and gives everyone more pleasure.

- G. Flowers last longer if the stem is cut on the slant, and a bit of ginger-ale added to the water extends display time. To keep hollow stem flowers longer, fill with water and plug with a bit of cotton-ball.
- H. Stems should **include first pair of leaves** at top of stem.
- I. Any other, refers to flowers not found in any other listed class.
- J. Dahlias should always have foliage attached.
